Bat-Faced Cuphea



Botanical Name: Cuphea llavea

Category: Perennial, may be annual in Texas

Blooms: March to October; red and purple flowers resemble a bat's face

Height: 2-3 feet Width: 3 feet

Light: Full sun, at least 6 hours or in filtered sun

Water: Drought tolerant but will flourish with watering during long dry spells

Soil: Well drained

Propagation: From cuttings taken during growing season

Attracts bees and butterflies

Notes: Pinching back in early summer will allow more branching; fertilize in midsummer and again in early fall with a light application of a balanced, slow release fertilizer. Work well with zinnias and Firebush or planted in front of cannas and upright-type elephant ears. No major pest or disease problems
